

NATURE COAST INTERGROUP BUSINESS MEETING

SEPTEMBER 29TH, 2013.

CHAIRPERSON RICK T. opened the meeting with a moment of silence followed by the Serenity Prayer.

VICE CHAIRPERSON GENET R. took a roll call and the following ten groups were represented:-Crystal River, Dunnellon New Beginnings, Floral City, High Noon, Rainbow, Resentment, Whats The Book Say, Women's Friendship, Women's New Beginnings, Won Rebos.

NEW REPRESENTATIVES:-Paige B. was welcomed as new representative from Whats The Book Say Group.

SECRETARY:-DENIS S. read the minutes of previous meeting and they were accepted as read.

TREASURER:- RICK T. reported that Bill W. was still recovering from health issues. Rick said that he went back two months and balanced the books as of September 25th, 2013. He said that in compliance with a unanimous decision at the previous meeting he disbursed the surplus funds no longer needed as a result of the closing of the bookstore. He reported closing the money market account and transferring the funds to the checking account. He further reported sending a check to District 28 for \$1000. He reported sending a check to Area 14 North Florida for \$500. He reported sending a check to GSO in New York for \$737 which included \$500 of disbursed funds, \$144.50 profits from the recent Picnic and \$92.50 from the 50/50 at the Picnic. His report was accepted.

TRUSTEES:- Paul B. recommended that information about Intergroup be distributed to the Groups. Debra S. said that she would check to see if our rent at The Holder Community Center is shared with District 28. Sandy H. and Steve N. had nothing to report.

HOTLINE:- DAVE N. reported a total of 78 calls for the month as follows:- AA 69, Alanon 2, NA 2, Treatment 2, Miscellaneous 3.

WEBMASTER:-DAVE B. sent a report of having paid a domain fee of \$36.34 and said that another domain fee will be due next month. He expects traffic on the website to increase as this is an end of Summer trend.

JOURNAL:- Rick T. reported that the Journal had been sent to the printer and would be picked up and distributed. He said also that it would be posted to the website as soon as possible.

EVENTS:- PAIGE B. said she will investigate rebooking Rainbow Springs State Park for the 2014 Summer Picnic as the venue proved very popular this year. Sandy H. said that preparations for the Gratitude Dinner on November 10th were going well and that a speaker Chuck from Hudson had been secured. She said the venue, Crystal River United Methodist Church, was chosen from the hat after all suitable venues were identified. Paige said that she had tickets and flyers for distribution and she can be contacted at (352)422-3189. She said ticket sales were going very well. It is expected that doors will open at 4pm, dinner will be at 5pm and the speaker at 6pm. The Readers will be from The Centers and festivities will include door prizes, a Chinese Auction of items left from the closing of the bookstore and a 50/50.
