



There were 4,730 books printed, with red cloth binding, wide columns, thick paper, (which was why it was called the Big Book in the first place) and a red, yellow, black and white dust jacket, which came to be known as the "circus cover."

To commemorate this historic printing and the Big Book's 75th anniversary the 2013 General Service Conference approved the creation of this facsimile edition, a faithful replica of the original, to be published in April 2014. This edition will be published in the original English language text only.

There are newly re-printed issues of the original 1951 and 1971 editions published to honor Dr. Bob and Bill upon their deaths. Each magazine contains the story of each founder's life and stories of friends and members of that time (\$5.99 for both).

Also available, is a Convention Special Edition: 75 Years of AA. This magazine has years of Grapevine history celebrating the people who kindled the AA flame lighting the way for millions of alcoholics (\$4.00 per issue while supplies last).
