### April in AA History

No leader of any social organization ever tried harder to relinquish power than did Bill Wilson. Having urged the membership for years to take over the responsibilities of AA, an experimental Service Conference was held in 1951. After pondering the situation for four years the membership finally understood that Bill and Bob could not live forever. At the

Conference of 1955 a statement

was issued as follows, "This resolution authorizes the General Service Conference to act for Alcoholics Anonymous and to become the successor to it's co-founders."

Because AA is an upside down organization, the resolution above means that the wishes of the members is transmitted through the GSR, the DCM and the Area Delegate to the General Service Conference which is held in New York each April. The responsibility passed on by Bill and Bob in 1955 therefore rests with each member and the welfare of the newcomer will forever be protected by the great consensus of all AA's members. For that reason it is important to attend those business meetings to become aware of the issues and to be as active as possible in the affairs of AA.

### WHY BE A REGISTERED/LISTED GROUP?


I have heard old-timers say that all you need to start a new A.A. group is a resentment and a coffee pot. It seems to be true as many new groups get started when a few A.A. members feel something is amiss and decide they would rather have a meeting of their own. As a matter of fact, starting a new group is not much more complicated than that. All that is needed is a small group of people who will take responsibility for the meetings: unlocking the door, finding a chairperson, making the coffee.

Alcoholics Anonymous groups may be formed by two or more AA members who for their mutual support agree to use the AA program of recovery and who as a group are not affiliated with any other organization. However, once groups become well established they are encouraged to register with G.S.O. and become a listed group. Most do, but many long term groups have not done so and as such may be missing opportunities to help the still suffering alcoholic outside the group's room.

To really understand the reasons to register, you must understand the nature of the A.A. Service structure. While

most organizations have a top down structure, A.A. reverses the pyramid, placing the A..A. Group at the top and the trustees on the bottom.

In the pyramid to the right, one thing is absolutely necessary to guarantee that "the hand of A.A. will always be there." That one thing is communication among all elements in the structure.



That communication and that alone will ensure the balance between the ultimate authority and responsibility which starts in the local group conscience meeting and the continuing existence of the day to day functioning of A.A. as a whole. Too often I hear people say things like, I don't like business meetings - they don't help me keep sober."

However, without group conscience (business) meetings, the group does not have a complete group purpose founded on the ultimate authority and responsibility which starts in the local group conscience meeting and the continuing existence of the day to day functioning of A.A. as a whole. Any group can become a registered group by submitting a form.

#### **BENEFITS OF BEING REGISTERED**

- Have a voice in AA as a whole because Groups listed with G.S.O. have either General Service. Representatives (G.S.R.s), or "group contacts," who act as channels for two-way information and shared experience.
- 2. G.S.R.s attending district meetings are an excellent resource for addressing group problems and concerns.
- 3. Have your group listed in Eastern US Directory.
- 4. Get Box 459 every other month.
- 5. Get the benefit of the shared experience, strength and hope of all the groups that are within our area.
- 6. Be connected to thousands of groups across the country.
- 7. Have available the expanding body of AA Literature.
- 8. Receive other informational mailings to your group from GSO, Area 14, District 28 and Nature Coast Intergroup.
