The first AA Group in Florida was formed in Jacksonville in May of 1941 just two years after the publication of the Big Book.


All completed forms will be copied and given to the North Florida Archivist Scott B. at the next Area Assembly in Gainesville in July.

ORIGIN OF THE SERENITY PRAYER

The origin of the "Serenity Prayer" has been a tantalizing, elusive and, some still feel, an unsolved mystery; intriguing to those who have attempted to trace the prayer to an authoritative, unimpeachable source. One comprehensive article from the GSO clearly reveals that the Serenity Prayer has had quite a history. At one point the prayer was attributed to Aristotle. Whatever its ancient or modern origin, this prayer seems to have been born, at least in spirit, far back in time out of an ancient perception and a suffering wisdom. Excepting for the Lord's Prayer and the Prayer of St. Francis, no other quotation or concept, at once so practical as well as spiritual, has taken over the mind and heart of every member who begins the A.A. journey of recovery. At the risk of appearing too frivolous, there have been some humorous yet apt endings to the prayer. Erma Bombeck, the popular comedic writer, gave this version: "God grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, courage to change the things I can, and the wisdom to keep my mouth shut when I don't know the difference..." Someone else suggested this ending: "...and the wisdom to keep my mouth shut even when I know I'm right"! (Nell Wing, 1981 (Secretary to Bill W.; First A.A. Archivist, 1954-1983) Finally, the GSO article attributes the prayer to Reinhold Niebuhr. Here is the original, full version: God grant me the Serenity to accept the things – I cannot change; Courage to change the things I can; and Wisdom to know the difference. Living one day at a time; Enjoying one moment at a time; Accepting hardship as the pathway to peace; Taking, as He did, this sinful world as it is, Not as I would have it: Trusting that He will make all things right if I surrender to His will; That I may be reasonably happy in this life, and supremely happy with Him forever in the next. Amen
