Why talk about God?

Every time we read "How it Works" at a meeting one sentence keeps popping out to me as a key to my sobriety. From Chapter 5 of the Big Book we read, "But there is One who has all power—that one is God. May you find Him now!"

And yet so many like me come to AA with the attitude that God has abandoned them or even that he must not exist. So how do these folks find a "power greater than themselves" if we do not talk about our spiritual experiences with the "God of our understanding." In Chapter 4 "We Agnostics" is where I found the answer. On page 55 the following paragraph appears: "We finally saw that faith in some kind of God was a part of our make-up... Sometimes we had to search

Sometimes we had to search

fearlessly, but He was there. He was as much a fact as we were. We found the Great Reality deep down within us." (*emphasis mine*)

So in my mind, the "power greater than ourselves" suddenly was not just "out there" in the heavens somewhere; or in a church or mosque or synagogue, but it is "in here." That insight changed everything for me. I came to realize God had not abandoned me. He was always there within me. It was I who had abandoned God. I thought I had to pray and meditate and invite God into my world when in actuality He was already there within me and always had been. My "fox hole" prayers that never seemed to get answered were requests to some mysterious outside being when in fact it is not about God doing something from outside.

The miracle of my sobriety was generated from the inside by that "Great Reality deep within." Once I realized that spiritual idea, my prayers and meditation became different and my spiritual growth became a solid reality.

This alcoholic cannot drink on the truth - only on a lie. That is why the first paragraph of *How it Works* discusses honesty three time. When I make contact with the "Great Reality deep

within," and allow that reality, which is truth to remain in charge of my mind and emotions, the miracles keep happening. I arrived in the rooms because reason was supreme in my life. I was spiritually dead and allowed only my thoughts to control. That was a disaster since I not only had a drinking problem, but I had a very serious thinking problem.

I am so grateful that I who fall in the category described in Chapter 5, "There are those, too, who suffer from grave emotional and mental disorders," have been able to recover through the grace of God within, the 12 step program of Alcoholics Anonymous, and the fellowship of all you recovered alcoholics in and out of the rooms. And it was God who I asked for "protection and care with complete abandon," (p 59) so yes, I will continue to talk about God. He is my story.
