

NATURE COAST INTERGROUP MEETING MINUTES

May 22, 2016

CHAIRPERSON Rick opened the meeting with a moment of silence followed by the Serenity Prayer.

JEN B. took a roll call and the following groups were represented: Attitude Adjustment, Crystal River, Freedom House Group, Holder Way of Life, Monday Night Men's Step, New Beginnings, Sober Sandgnats, What's the Book Say, Women to Women. A total of 9 groups were present with 11 people in total.

SECRETARY:- Jen B. read the minutes of the previous meeting. The minutes were accepted as read.

TREASURER:- Paige read the final report for April 2016 of a beginning balance of \$1219.31 with an ending balance of \$1128.30. The treasurer's report was read and accepted. The February Preliminary was presented and final numbers will be out for the next meeting.

TRUSTEES:- Janet had a great time at the picnic and wanted to thank those that helped her sell tickets. Denis went to the picnic and it was a great event. Sandy made it to the picnic, thought it was a great time, a good amount of people and everyone was enjoying themselves. She thought everyone who put it together did a great job. Bill was not able to attend.

HOTLINE:- Dean read the report for Sober Sandknats who took the commitment for May. 37 calls to date. 24 looking for meeting, 3 rides, 3 someone to talk to with 3 wet calls resulting in treatment. Another call was from someones brother who needed treatment.

WEBMASTER:- Steve N., Webmaster, 633 sessions by 493 unique visitors this month. Each session viewed an average of 2.9 pages. The bounce rate was 61% indicating more people are staying longer at the site. Total hits was 28,500 indicating longer at the site. Meetings were the reason for visiting this month with 70 visits to the meeting home page, 120 to meetings by day, 53 to meetings by location, 3 to about meetings, and 127 visits to specific days with as usual Monday topping the list. After meeting information the next most visited pages were NCI Calendar, resource links, NCI minutes, District news. Newcomer information, contributions, audio aa information, and the Young Adult page. The top downloads included the tradition mp4, Journal, Where and When, and various flyers. An interesting statistic this month was where our site is referred to from 35.9% came from a direct user input, 14% from Google, 9% from aacitrus.org, 2% from Club Recovery and the rest too small to report, Numerous changes to where and when, calendar and flyers were made this month.

JOURNAL:- Lynn was unable to attend. Per Paige she is getting one out the first week in June.

EVENTS:- - Lynn G. said the Spring Fling was a success, we even made a profit. Not all the monies from this event are in yet but so far our profit is \$239. We had about 60 to 70 people attended. In the future do we want to keep this event the way we have been doing it or do we want to have a pot luck type of event and call it a brunch. We had very few people bring a dish to pass this year. When we have events that are pot luck type I would like everyone to encourage people to bring a dish for all to enjoy. Our next event is the Long Timers speakers meeting on July 14th. I already have 3 speakers for this event. It will be the same as last years with the old fashion bake sale. The speakers are Suzanne B 35yrs, Al 52 years, Joanie 37 years, The MC is Bill B.

CHAIRPERSON:- Rick was very excited about what is getting done in NCI and wanted to say he has never had a more active and competent group.

Alternate Chairperson Report: Steve N. wanted to acknowledge the large contribution of \$2000 from Crystal River Group and how great it was.
