

## SERVICE

The Intergroup relies on A.A. group members to perform Twelfth-Step service. Service at Intergroup usually consists of answering the Hotline, arranging A.A. member Twelfth-Step contacts for newcomers, helping callers to get to meetings and/or serving on Intergroup Service Committees. Intergroups usually publish local A.A. meeting lists and newsletters. Intergroup acts as an information exchange for local groups coordinating activities no single group can perform.


