## **SERVICE OPPORTUNITIES**



Intergroup has two open positions.

The **Special Events Chairperson** must have one year of continuous sobriety and be able to attend the Intergroup meetings. The Special Events Chair coordinates the Founder's Day and Gratitude events as well as athletic events, dances, and picnics. The term of the position is one year.

A **Trustee** – The Board of Trustees oversees the Officers and operations of NCI, Inc. Each Trustee shall discharge his/her responsibility as a trusted servant, bearing in mind at all times that his/her actions are for the benefit of all AA groups and that principles should come before personalities. Trustees should have prior service to AA as either an Intergroup Rep, Committee Chair, or Officer and be familiar with the Nature Coast Intergroup By-Laws. The term of the office is two years.


